Choirs Festival, Channel 4 & BBC TV and Artichoke Productions UK. Also; Calculated Risks Opera, The Australian Opera, The Sydney Metropolitan Opera, The Lyric Opera of Queensland, ABC TV and the Queensland Theatre Company in Australia.

She has sung on backing tracks including on the solo album for the late Michael Hutchence (INXS) as well as jingles, TV in Australia and the UK. Until recently Heather taught singing and voice at the University of Surrey in PATS and GSA -the Guildford School of Acting, on the Music Theatre and Acting courses.

A singing teacher with the National Youth Choirs of Great Britain, she has also facilitated master-classes in singing performance with the Yehudi Menuhin School and various other Universities and Schools in the UK. She was a freelance trainer with Vocal Process and Resonance Voice Company, London, UK. Clients included: singing teachers on the Vocal Process core training, the Foreign and Commonwealth Office London, The Wellcome Trust and the Metropolitan Police.

Heather has recently returned to Australia and has joined the voice / singing staff at the University of Newcastle, Conservatorium of Music, NSW. She currently offers Singing Teaching, Voice Training, Accent and Dialect Coaching, Phonetics training, Workshops and Master-classes through her company 'The Art Of Voice'. Her most recent workshops were facilitated at Wollongong University and Newcastle University in October 2015.

Heather is currently training as an examiner for the new AMEB Music Theatre exams, launching this year.
