JAMES SHIPSTONE



James' career began in the UK where he received guitar tuition alongside Andy Somers (The Police) and Robert Fripp (King Crimson), was a founding member of the UK group "Nite People", toured extensively in the UK and Europe performing on the US Forces bases and then performing at major festivals and concerts with legendary artists such as The Beach Boys, Deep Purple, Led Zeppelin, Nice (Keith Emerson), Pink Floyd, Motown and Stax artists such as Martha and the Vandellas, Otis Redding and many more.

After emigrating to Perth, Western Australia, James joined RCA Records in 1978. During two decades with the company (which became known as BMG) he worked in Sales, Promotion, Marketing, Domestic and International Label Management and International Artist and Repertoire. In the latter half of his time with BMG, James was the Managing

Director of Music Publishing Australia and New Zealand, was a Publisher Member of APRA and a Director on the AMCOS Board. James is now an active songwriter and APRA Writer Member having just completed work on 2 stage musicals which will debut later this year.
